RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE AWARD OF CONTRACT THROUGH NEGOTIATED PROCUREMENT UNDER SECTION 53.10 (LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY / VENUE) FOR THE LEASE OF VENUE WITH MEALS AND ACCOMMODATION FOR CURRICULUM REVIEW AND ENHANCEMENT TRAINING FOR THE CCJE DEPARTMENT OF MinSU

WHEREAS, the Mindoro State University (MinSU) through the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) will host a Curriculum Review and Enhancement Training on May 15-17, 2024 and intends to lease a venue with food and accommodation, with an Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) amounting to **One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty Pesos (Php125,440.00)**;

WHEREAS, the subject item was included in the Project Procurement Management Plan (PPMP) of the requisitioning office and in the approved Annual Procurement Plan (APP) of MinSU;

WHEREAS, Sec. 53.10 of the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Republic Act (RA) No. 9184, otherwise known as the Government Procurement Reform Act of 2003", allows Negotiated Procurement as a mode of procurement for the lease of privately owned real property and venue for official use, subject to the Consolidated Guidelines for the Alternative Methods of Procurement of the 2016 Revised IRR of RA 9184;

WHEREAS, Annex H (IV)(J) of the 2016 revised IRR allows the conduct of Shopping and Negotiated Procurement under Emergency Cases, Small Value Procurement, Lease of Real Property and Venue to be delegated to the End-User unit or any other appropriate bureau, committee or support unit duly authorized by the BAC;

WHEREAS, the CCJE Department of MinSU coordinated with the BAC through its Secretariat, initiated the procurement activity by sending the Request for Quotation (RFQ) to three (3) prospective lessors; (1) **ADH (Arnulfo D. Helera) Development Group, Inc.** (2) **Francesca Resort and Hotels Incorporation** and (3); **Amor Beach Resort**;

WHEREAS, the detailed evaluation resulted in the following:

WHEREAS, the TWG of MinSU certified that the lessor complied with the evaluation and recommended the awarding of contract for the Lease of Venue including Meals and Accommodation for the conduct of **Curriculum Review and Enhancement Training** to **ADH (Arnulfo D. Helera) Development Group, Inc.** with an official address at Brgy. Quezon St., Zone III, Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro.

NARRATIVE REPORT

The College of Criminal Justice Education, under the leadership of Dean Dr. Salcedo B. Tanguid, Jr., conducted a three-day Curriculum Review and Enhancement workshop themed "Empowering Learners through Collaborative and Adaptive Curriculum (ELCAC)" from May 15 to 17, 2024. The event took place at Bulaklak Beach Resort in Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro. The workshop was attended by all faculty members of the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) and various stakeholders, reflecting a collective effort to refine and advance the curriculum.

MAY 15, 2024

✓ **Departure, Arrival, and Preparation**

The CCJE faculty, staff, and selected student leaders departed from the MinSU-Calapan campus at exactly 6:00 AM, arriving at Bulaklak Beach Resort in Pinamalayan at 8:00 AM. Upon arrival, they began preparing the venue and arranging the necessary materials for the first activity of the event. From 10:00 to 11:00 AM, the guest speaker and stakeholders started to arrive, and the college welcomed them warmly. Each attendee was provided with a kit containing materials needed for the seminar.

✓ **First Activity- Seminar on Overview of the Criminology Curriculum**

At around 11:00 AM, the seminar commenced, hosted by Mrs. Bernadette P. De Guzman. The event began with a prayer led by Ms. Krystel Jandulong, followed by the playing of the AVP of the National Anthem and the MinSU Hymn. Dr. Salcedo B. Tanguid, Jr. delivered his opening remarks, which were followed by an inspirational message from the administration's representative, Dr. Polemer Cuarto. Dr. Tanguid then presented the existing and proposed curriculum. After the presentation, the audience was serenaded with a song performed by Ms. Romelyn Espiritu. Afterwards, the participants had their lunch.

After the lunch break, Mrs. Bernadette P. De Guzman reopened the event. Mrs. Elanie M. Mendoza then introduced the guest speaker, Atty. Theodore M. Timpac, PhD. Atty. Timpac gave a presentation on the overview of the Criminology curriculum and shared the best practices of Tarlac State University, highlighting its consistent performance as one of the top schools in the Criminologist Licensure Examination.

Following Atty. Timpac's presentation, an open forum began around 3:00 PM. Participants engaged with questions, comments, and suggestions about the presentations by Dr. Tanguid and Atty. Timpac. The presenters addressed these inquiries thoroughly. The forum concluded at exactly 4:08 PM.

Following the forum, the awarding of certificates to the guest speaker and participants commenced. This was followed by photo opportunities for all attendees. Mr. Danilo L. Tupaz, Jr. then delivered the closing remarks, bringing the seminar to a close at exactly 5:00 PM.

✓ **Second Activity- Team Building Activity**

At around 5:45 PM, the team-building activity began, involving the CCJE faculty, staff, and selected student leaders. Facilitated by Ms. Romelyn Espiritu, the participants were divided into two groups. The event featured a series of games, fostering camaraderie and teamwork among the participants. The team-building activity concluded at 10:00 PM.

MAY 16, 2024

✓ **First Activity- Seminar on Qualitative Research**

At around 9:00 AM on the second day, the first activity was a seminar on qualitative research, hosted by Ms. Krystel Jandulong. The event began with a prayer led by Ms. Nona Velasquez. Dr. Tanguid then delivered his opening remarks, followed by inspirational messages from Dr. Nemesio Davalos and Ms. Cristine L. German. The participants were once again serenaded by Ms. Romelyn Espiritu before Ms. Nona Velasquez introduced the speaker.

Dr. Alice Ramos commenced her presentation, focusing on Criminological Qualitative Research. She also addressed the application of research within the proposed curriculum, highlighting how research methodologies and findings can be integrated to enhance the academic program. Her insights provided the participants with valuable knowledge and perspectives. During the subsequent open forum, many questions



were posed, which Dr. Alice Ramos adeptly addressed, enriching the participants' understanding even further.

Following the open forum, the event proceeded with the awarding of tokens and a certificate to the guest speaker, Dr. Alice Ramos. Subsequently, Ms. Glanys Wajima Rocell De Guzman delivered the closing remarks, marking the end of the seminar at 11:30 AM.

✓ **Second Activity- Preparation and Critiquing of Syllabus**

At approximately one o'clock in the afternoon, Dr. Tanguid hosted a session for the preparation and critique of syllabi prepared by faculty members of the CCJE. Each faculty member presented their crafted syllabus, which was then critiqued by Dr. Tanguid, Atty. Timpac, Dr. Cuarto, and Dr. Davalos. These experts provided valuable insights, comments, suggestions, and recommendations aimed at enhancing the quality of the faculty's syllabi. The session concluded around five o'clock in the afternoon.

✓ **Third Activity- Socialization Night**

At around 7:00 PM, the socialization night commenced, with participation from all the faculty, staff, and selected student leaders of the college, along with the continued presence of Atty. Timpac. The event facilitated meaningful conversations on improving the college's operations and encouraged open communication among participants. Attendees shared their experiences and insights, fostering a collaborative atmosphere. Additionally, a series of mind games were conducted to further enhance the participants' capabilities. The session concluded around 10:00 PM.

MAY 17, 2024

✓ **Preparation of Course Description**


At approximately eight o'clock in the morning, under the direction of Dr. Salcedo Tanguid, Jr., the process of crafting the new course descriptions for the included courses in the proposed curriculum began. Dr. Tanguid organized the Criminology faculty members into specialized groups and assigned them the responsibility of proposing content for the course descriptions. Subsequently, these proposals were submitted to the dean for further consideration and review. The preparation of the course descriptions concluded at 11:30 AM.

✓ **Departure**

At approximately two o'clock in the afternoon, the participants departed from Bulaklak Beach Resort. Their journey concluded upon arrival in Calapan City at around four o'clock in the afternoon.

Therefore, the series of activities orchestrated under the leadership of Dr. Salcedo Tanguid, Jr. underscored a commitment to academic excellence and continuous improvement within the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE). From curriculum review and enhancement workshops to seminars on qualitative research and syllabi preparation, each event served as a platform for faculty members and stakeholders to collaborate, exchange insights, and refine educational practices. Through these endeavors, the CCJE not only demonstrated a proactive approach to curriculum development but also emphasized the importance of fostering a culture of innovation and scholarship. As a result, the College is poised to deliver a curriculum that is adaptive, collaborative, and aligned with the dynamic demands of the field, ultimately empowering learners and advancing the discipline of criminal justice education.





At the opening event of the three-day BS Criminology Curriculum Review and Enhancement, Dr. Salcedo B. Tanguid, Jr. presented both the existing and proposed curricula. Additionally, Atty. Theodore Timpac, PhD, delivered an overview of the Criminology curriculum and shared the best practices from Tarlac State University. These presentations set the stage for the subsequent open forum.

The Open Forum officially began at three o'clock in the afternoon, immediately following the guest speaker Atty. Timpac's presentation. Dr. Tanguid then opened the floor for comments, suggestions, and recommendations from the audience.

A CCPS police officer proposed integrating the theoretical driving course from the LTO into the PATHFIT 05-Defense Driving with Road Safety Education curriculum. He also noted the absence of a clear program of instructions for On-The-Job Trainees. These concerns were addressed by both Atty. Timpac and Dr. Tanguid.

Atty. Timpac concurred with the second issue raised, stating that it is indeed a challenge for the CMO that needs to be addressed by CHED. He further elaborated on the varied implementation of OJT deployment across different educational institutions.

Dr. Tanguid first thanked the HPG Officers for their attendance. He explained that, in both the existing and proposed curriculums, Traffic Management and Accident Investigation are separate from Defensive Driving with Road Safety Education, which contrasts with the course structure stipulated in the CMO. He assured that the suggestion to integrate the theoretical driving course would be considered during the development of the course description and syllabus. Additionally, he mentioned that MinSU already facilitates the participation of students in LTO programs for licensing. He also proposed collaborating with the LTO to conduct lectures at MinSU.

Furthermore, a police officer from HPG commended the courses offered by the BS Criminology program of MinSU in both the existing and proposed curriculums. Similar to the first stakeholder, he commented on the absence of a clear program of instructions for On-The-Job Trainees. Additionally, he expressed concerns about the security of students deployed to their respective offices, emphasizing that the responsibility for their safety would fall on their department.

On the other hand, Dr. Cuarto, representing the administration during the seminar, commended Atty. Timpac for his comprehensive presentation. He recommended that the college should consider offering summer term to reduce the course load in the fourth year, allowing students to focus more on their OJT. Dr. Cuarto also noted that most programs at MinSU include Research course in the third year. He explained that the lack of time for research compliance among students is a significant issue, underscoring the need to maintain the Research subject in the third year to address this problem effectively. His concerns was answered by Dr. Tanguid.

Dr. Tanguid responded that the suggestion would be considered in the development of the new curriculum. However, he explained that the second and third years are already quite loaded with core courses. He also expressed concerns that no faculty might be available to teach during the summer term due to potential conflicts regarding the granting of service credits to those faculty members.

Additionally, a police officer from the PNP Maritime Group thanked the college for the invitation to attend the seminar and curriculum presentation. He also commended Atty. Timpac for his insightful presentation. The officer commented on the audio-visual presentation shown during breaks, which highlighted the college's accomplishments during the 2024 Criminology Days, particularly the Reception



Rites. He suggested that, given the rigorous physical activities students undergo, the college should implement medical examinations before the Reception Rites. He emphasized the critical importance of medical examinations, noting their necessity for applicants to the PNP. His concern was responded by Dr. Tanguid.

Dr. Tanguid explained that medical examinations are an integral part of the freshmen admission process, as well as a prerequisite before OJT deployment and a requirement for student retention. This protocol is in place to mitigate the liability of the agencies where OJT trainees will be deployed. He also mentioned the consideration of a new memorandum aimed at further reducing the potential liability of partner agencies.

An officer from the HPG raised a query regarding the height requirements for the PNP. He inquired about the steps the college has taken to address the issue of students who do not meet the height requirements. Atty. Timpac and Dr. Tanguid responded to this concern.

Atty. Timpac emphasized that the practice of criminology extends beyond just the tri-bureau, highlighting the diverse career opportunities available within the field.

Additionally, Dr. Tanguid explained that while the height requirement is part of the admission policy, it is not a mandatory criterion as discussed in a recent Board of Regents (BOR) meeting he attended. However, exemptions are made for members of minority groups. He emphasized that the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE) is the only college with this specific provision.

A BJMP officer raised a concern regarding the confusion surrounding the topics to be taught and covered in the new course, Therapeutic Modality. He suggested that the BJMP is open to conducting training and seminars for both students and faculty to address this issue. Furthermore, he proposed a collaboration between the two institutions, which Dr. Tanguid welcomed and expressed hope for this partnership to materialize soon.

Another HPG officer inquired whether first-aid techniques are included in any of the courses. Dr. Tanguid explained that these techniques are covered in the course PATHFIT 03 - First Aid and Water Survival.

Additionally, Ma'am Elanie Mendoza, a faculty member of CCJE, commended Atty. Timpac for his presentation. She inquired if the 181 units proposed in the new curriculum could be increased to accommodate an additional course as part of the integrated review in the fourth year. Atty. Timpac responded affirmatively, suggesting that three areas could be covered in the first semester and three more in the second semester.

An HPG officer asked Atty. Timpac if the curriculum could be adjusted by reducing some units and adding others. Dr. Tanguid affirmed this possibility. Atty. Timpac explained that the RQAT (Regional Quality Assurance Team) has been at fault for prioritizing the completeness of courses over practicality. He emphasized that the curriculum should focus more on meeting the students' needs.

Dr. Cuarto suggested offering the General Education courses during the summer term to alleviate issues faced by COS employees. Dr. Tanguid acknowledged the suggestion, stating that it would be noted and considered.

Sir Raymond Taladtad, a faculty member of CCJE, suggested in the proposed curriculum that the course CLJ 07- Evidence for fourth years could be moved to the third year to allocate more time for the integrated review. Dr. Tanguid responded that this suggestion would be taken into consideration and added as an option to be presented in the academic council.

Dr. Tanguid inquired with the partner agencies about their policies regarding interns wearing shirts with the logo of the PNP or uniforms closely resembling those of law enforcement personnel. An officer from the HPG clarified that while it has always been prohibited to copy the PNP uniform, however, there are exemptions for academic purposes. He suggested limiting the duration of uniform wearing and coordinating with the PNP for guidelines. Additionally, he proposed collaborating and coordinating with the Association of Criminologists in the Philippines to ensure uniformity.



Additionally, Dr. Tanguid highlighted the issue of MinSU's two campuses offering the BS Criminology Program having different uniforms. He raised the question of how to unify them. Ma'am Glanys De Guzman, the program chairperson of BS Criminology at the Bongabong campus, expressed her agreement with the idea of having a unified uniform. She suggested holding a design contest as a means to achieve this goal.

Moreover, Sir Danilo Tupaz, the program chairperson of BS Criminology at the Calapan campus, inquired about the possibility of offering ETEEAP (Expanded Tertiary Education Equivalency and Accreditation Program) at MinSU. Dr. Tanguid responded that it is planned to be offered as part of the Graduate Studies in the 12-Year Development Plan. He elaborated on the stringent requirements necessary for its implementation. Additionally, Atty. Timpac raised concerns about the potential impact on the school's licensure examination passing rate if ETEEAP will be offered. He suggested considering offering a master's course at MinSU instead. Dr. Tanguid stated that this suggestion would be taken into consideration, further explaining the requirements for such a program.

Dr. Tanguid invited the audience to share any remaining questions, comments, or recommendations. With no further matters raised for discussion, he officially declared the open forum closed precisely at 4:08 PM.

I. RATIONALE

The curriculum of the Bachelor of Science in Criminology under the College of Criminal Justice Education has been designed five years ago which at present requires review and enhancement to align and enrich the curriculum with new CMOs, modern approaches, technologies, and resources that promote learner autonomy, skill development, and lifelong learning habits. Likewise, the new developments in the table of specifications for the Criminologists Licensure Examination necessitate updating of the description of the core courses.

Curriculum review and enhancement has been emphasized during the previous accreditations conducted for the BSCRIM program by the AACUP evaluators. 9. LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY AND VENUE¹⁷⁸

a) Definition. Procurement covering lease of real property and venue for official use, where:

- i. Real Property refers to land and buildings (office spaces or units) and constructions of all kinds adhered to the soil.
- ii. Venue refers to training centers, convention halls, hotels, and similar establishments catering to trainings, seminars, conferences, conventions, symposia and similar gatherings requiring the official participation of government officials and employees. This may include meals and accommodation depending on the requirements of the Procuring Entity.
- iii. Lessee refers to any government agency temporarily occupying a real property on the basis of a contract executed with the private individual, partnership, cooperative, association, or corporation having absolute ownership over such real property.
- iv. Lessor refers to any government agency or private individual, partnership, cooperative, association, or corporation having absolute ownership over the real property or venue to be leased.

b) Policy Considerations

- i. Publicly-owned vis-a-vis privately-owned real property and venue

It is preferred that government agencies lease publicly-owned real property or venue from other government agencies.

If there is an available publicly-owned real property or venue that complies with the requirements of the Procuring Entity, it may enter into a contract of lease with the government-agency owner.

In the event that the Procuring Entity would resort to privately-owned real property or venue, the End-User unit shall justify that the same is more efficient and economical to the government.

- ii. Location

The location of the real property or venue to be leased should have been meticulously selected by the Procuring Entity after

taking into consideration, among others, the need for prudence and economy in government service and the suitability of the area in relation to the mandate of the office, and its accessibility to its clients. In the lease of venue, other factors such as the nature of the event or the level of security in the proposed location may also be taken into account.

iii. ABC and rental rates

The ABC shall be set using the midpoint of the range obtained from the results of the market analysis on the prevailing lease rates for real property or venue within the vicinity of the selected location complying with the criteria and technical specifications of the End- User Unit. In no case shall the rental rates, including additional expenses, such as association dues in the case of lease of real property, exceed the ABC.

As a general rule, rental rates are considered reasonable when they represent or approximate the value of what the Lessee gets in terms of accommodation, facility, amenities, and convenience from the leased real property or venue, and the Lessor gets an equitable return of capital or investment.

Rental rates should also be within the prevailing market rates for lease of real property or venue with the same or similar condition or classification and located within the vicinity. Rental rate refers to the amount paid by the Lessee for the use and/or occupancy of the privately-owned real property to the Lessor, where payment is usually made on a monthly basis.

iv. Technical Specifications

Technical Specification shall be prepared taking into consideration the rating factors under Appendix B of this Guidelines.

c) Procedures for Lease of Privately-Owned Real Property and Venue

i. Real Property

- a) The BAC shall invite at least three (3) prospective Lessors to submit sealed price quotations or password-protected price quotations in compressed archive folders, in case of electronic submission of price quotations.¹⁷⁹

On a specified date, submitted price quotations shall be opened to determine the Lowest Calculated Quotation. Receipt of at least one (1) quotation is sufficient to proceed with the evaluation thereof.

For electronic submission of price quotations, the passwords for accessing the same will be disclosed by the prospective Lessors on a specified date which may be done in person or face-to-face through videoconferencing, webcasting or similar technology.¹⁸⁰

- b) The real property being offered by the Lessor with the Single or Lowest Calculated Quotation shall be rated in accordance with the technical specifications and the reasonableness of its price quotation shall be determined in accordance with the methodology prescribed in Appendix B.
- c) Upon determination of the responsiveness and reasonableness of the quotation, the BAC shall recommend to the HOPE the award of contract in favor of the Lessor with the Single or Lowest Calculated and Responsive Quotation. Award of contract shall be made in accordance with Section IV(L) of this Guidelines.

ii. Venue

- a) The BAC shall send the RFQ to at least three (3) venues within the vicinity of the selected location. Receipt of at least one (1) quotation is sufficient to proceed with the evaluation thereof.
- b) The venue being offered by the Lessor with the Lowest Calculated Quotation shall then be rated in accordance with the technical specifications prepared pursuant to Appendix B of this Guidelines. Compliance rating with technical specifications may be conducted through ocular inspection, interviews, or other forms of due diligence.
- c) Upon determination of the responsiveness of the quotation, the BAC shall recommend to the HOPE the award of contract in favor of the Lessor with the Single or Lowest Calculated and Responsive Quotation. Award of contract shall be made in accordance with Section IV(L) of this Guidelines.

d) Renewal of Contract of Lease of Real Property

- i. Prior to the expiration of the lease contract, the end-user of the procuring entity must conduct a cost-benefit analysis to assess the quality of service under the lease contract. For instance, it must compare the rental rates charged by its lessor against other lessors in the area. It must also analyze whether entering into a new contract will be more expensive taking into consideration the cost of transfer and accessibility to the public. In assessing the existing lease, PEs are encouraged to consult relevant government agencies regarding any new policy or directive in the lease of real property.⁽ⁿ⁾

- ii. If the results of the CBA, conducted by the end-user, continue to favor the existing lessor, then the Head of the Procuring Entity (HoPE) may renew its lease contract subject to the Guidelines on Renewal of Regular and Recurring Services.¹⁸¹ If it does not, then the PE should procure a new lease contract in accordance with Section 53.10 of the IRR of RA 9184 and these guidelines.

10. DIRECT RETAIL PURCHASE OF PETROLEUM FUEL, OIL AND LUBRICANT (POL) PRODUCTS, AIRLINE TICKETS, AND ONLINE SUBSCRIPTIONS^{182(a)}

- a. Policy Considerations.** All procurement of POL products, airline tickets, and online subscriptions shall be done through competitive bidding, except when the Procuring Entity has determined that Direct Retail Purchase is the best modality for the procurement of (i) non-bulk POL products or where fees for additional services or functionalities are charged on top of the payment for the required POL products, (ii) airline tickets, or online subscriptions.¹⁸³⁽ⁿ⁾

In case of competitive bidding, other factors such as value-added or related services may also be taken into account in determining the procurement project's ABC.¹⁸⁴⁽ⁿ⁾

- b. Definition.** Where Goods and Services are required by a Procuring Entity for the efficient discharge of its principal mandate, governmental functions, or day-to-day operations, direct retail purchase of (i) POL products, and airline tickets, and (iii) online subscriptions may be made by end-users delegated to procure the same from identified direct suppliers or service providers.¹⁸⁵⁽ⁿ⁾

Online subscription shall cover (i) electronic publications, reference materials, and journals; (ii) computer software and applications such as video conferencing applications, computer-aided design and drafting applications, office productivity tools, and system protection software; (iii) web-based services such as news and social media monitoring tools; and (iv) off-the-shelf information systems, except internet and cloud computing services.⁽ⁿ⁾

- c. Conditions.** The procurement of POL products, airline tickets, and online subscriptions can be contracted by the end-user to identified direct suppliers or service providers under the following conditions:¹⁸⁶

MARKETING ANALYSIS

RATIONALE

The curriculum of the Bachelor of Science in Criminology under the College of Criminal Justice Education has been designed five years ago which at present requires review and enhancement to align and enrich the curriculum with new CMOs, modern approaches, technologies, and resources that promote learner autonomy, skill development, and lifelong learning habits. By addressing these issues, the College can enhance the quality of instruction and better prepare the students in the actual work setting.

Therefore, this proposal is crucial in ensuring that the curriculum review and enhancement process is inclusive, equitable, and promotes the growth of educational standards and strategies for all students.

OBJECTIVES

The program aims to:

1. Develop a logical framework that justifies the need for periodic assessment of current teaching methods, learning materials, pedagogical approaches, and overall system performance based on measurable outcomes like student achievements over time compared against national or international standards alongside emerging trends within the field of criminology.

4. Improve instructional strategies that promote critical thinking skills, problem-solving abilities, creativity, collaboration, communication, self-reflection, resilience, adaptability, and lifelong learning among students.

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
