December 31, 2024

GENERAL INFORMATION

Spouses Gregorio and Victoria Hora is engaged in retail of feeds and other agricultural supply. The principal address and place of business is located at National Highway, Poblacion 1, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro. The business was registered with the Department of Trade and Industry on February 18, 2019 under Registration Certificate No. 05852395 and is valid until February 18, 2024.

The accompanying financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 (with comparative figures for December 31, 2023) was authorized for issue by the proprietors on February 19, 2025.

BASIS OF PREPARATION AND PRESENTATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Basis of Preparation and Presentation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Philippine Financial Reporting Standards (PFRS).

The accompanying financial statements are presented in Philippine Peso, which is the business' functional currency, and all values represent absolute amounts except when otherwise indicated.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with PFRS requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amount of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period or in the period of the revision and the future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

Judgment are made by management on the development, section and disclosure of the business' critical accounting policies and estimates and the application of these policies and estimates.

Impairment of Assets

In accordance with the company's policy of impairment of assets, the proprietors performed an impairment indicators that are present. In determining the present value of future cash flows expected to be generated from the continued used of the assets, the proprietors are required to make estimates and assumptions that can materially affect the financial statements.

UBO GENERAL MERCHANDISE

SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The more significant accounting policies and practices of the business are set forth below to facilitate the understanding of data presented in the financial statements.

Cash

Cash includes cash on hand and in banks and is stated at its face value.

Receivables

Receivables are recognized initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortized cost using effective interest method less provision for impairment. A provision for impairment of receivables is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of receivables. The amount of the provision is the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the effective interest rate.

Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Net realizable value represents the estimated selling price less all estimated cost to completion and cost to be incurred in marketing, selling and distribution.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation, amortization and impairment losses, if any.

Initially, an item of property, plant and equipment is measured at its cost, which comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition. Subsequent expenditures are added to the carrying amount of the asset when it is probable that future economic benefits, in excess of the originally assed standard of performance, will flow to the Company. All Other subsequent expenditures are recognized as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Estimated useful lives are on the average of 20 years.

The useful lives and depreciation and amortization method are reviewed at each balance sheet date to ensure that the period and method of depreciation and amortization are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from those assets.

When asset is disposed of, or is permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefits are expected from its disposal, the cost and accumulated depreciation, amortization and impairment losses, if any, are removed from the accounts and any resulting gain or loss arising from the retirement or disposal is recognized in the statements of income.

Asset Impairment

The carrying amounts of the Company's assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine there is an indication of impairment. If any such indication exist, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash-generating units exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognized in the statement of income.

The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use.

An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. An Impairment loss is reversed only to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined,

net of depreciation or amortization, if no impairment loss had been recognized. Reversals of impairment are recognized in the statement of income.

Revenue and Expense Recognition

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized upon delivery, when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer and the amount of revenue can be measured reliably.

Cost & Expenses are recorded when incurred.

Income Taxes

Income tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises of current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in the statement of income except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

Current income tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Provisions

Provisions are recognized only when the business has (a) a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of past event; (b) it is probable (i.e. more likely than not) that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; and (c) a reliable statement can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate.

Contingencies

Contingent liabilities are not recognized in the financial statements. They are disclosed unless the possibility of an outflow of resources embodying benefits is remote. Contingent assets are not recognized in the financial statements but are disclosed when an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

Events after Balance Sheet Date

Post-year-end events that provide additional information about the Company's position at the balance sheet date (adjusting event) are reflected in the financial statements. Post-year end events that are not adjusting events are disclosed in the notes when material.

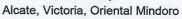

Project Description

The project aims to establish a 10-hectare rice farm within Mindoro State University- Campus Annex by procuring the necessary agricultural inputs for efficient and sustainable rice production. The farm will serve as both a production site and a hands-on educational facility for students pursuing degrees in agriculture, environmental science, and related disciplines. The university plans to acquire high-quality rice seeds, organic fertilizers, pesticides, modern farming tools, and equipment that are essential for the project's successful implementation. The farm will also serve as a research hub for innovative agricultural techniques, such as sustainable farming practices, pest management strategies, and climate-resilient crop varieties. The rice farm will benefit from the university's expertise in agricultural research, making it a model for sustainable farming in the region. In addition to agricultural productivity, this project will play an important role in providing local food security and advancing MinSU's agricultural education efforts.

Introduction

Rice is a staple food in the Philippines, playing a crucial role in the nation's economy and food security. Mindoro State University (MinSU) is strategically positioned to contribute to the enhancement of rice production in the region. This proposal outlines a comprehensive plan for an ten-hectare rice production project aimed at improving agricultural practices, increasing yield, and promoting sustainable farming methods among local farmers.

The agricultural landscape in Oriental Mindoro is characterized by diverse farming systems, yet it faces challenges such as limited access to modern agricultural technologies, inadequate training, and fluctuating market prices. By establishing a dedicated rice production project within the university's premises, MinSU can serve as a model for innovation and education in rice farming. This initiative aligns with the university's mission to advance rural development through technology transfer and capacity building, ultimately enhancing the socio-economic status of local communities.

The proposed project will not only focus on increasing rice yield but also emphasize sustainable agricultural practices that are crucial in the face of climate change and resource scarcity. By







integrating research, education, and community engagement, MinSU can foster an environment conducive to agricultural innovation while addressing the pressing needs of local farmers.

Rationale:

The establishment of a 10-hectare rice farm at Mindoro State University addresses several critical needs in the agricultural sector. First, rice is a staple crop in the Philippines and a primary source of food for the population. However, the country faces challenges in rice production due to factors such as outdated farming practices, climate change, and lack of access to quality inputs. In Mindoro, smallholder farmers often struggle with limited resources, low yields, and environmental constraints. By implementing a large-scale rice project, MinSU can demonstrate sustainable farming methods that can be adopted by local farmers, thereby improving their productivity and income. Furthermore, the project provides an opportunity for students to engage directly with the agricultural industry, learning about best practices in rice farming and participating in research on new techniques and crop varieties. Through these efforts, the project will not only enhance the region's food security but will also serve as a catalyst for agricultural innovation and community development. This initiative aligns with MinSU's educational and research mandates, contributing to its goal of advancing agricultural knowledge, improving community welfare, and addressing the pressing challenges of rural development.

This project promotes gender equality by ensuring that both male and female students have equal access to the learning opportunities provided by the rice farm. Women will be encouraged to participate in both fieldwork and decision-making processes, thereby empowering them in agricultural activities. The project will also ensure that resources and training are equitably distributed.

Objectives:

General Objective:

To develop a sustainable and high-yielding 10-hectare rice project at Mindoro State University that will strengthen local food security, enrich agricultural education, offer research opportunities, and generate revenue for the university. This initiative will also prioritize gender equality and development (GAD) by ensuring equal involvement of both men and women in all aspects of the project, from planning to implementation.

Specific Objectives:

- 1. To procure and utilize high-quality agricultural inputs such as rice seeds, fertilizers, pesticides, and farm tools necessary for rice production.
- To implement and demonstrate modern and sustainable farming practices on the 10hectare rice farm.
- To engage male and female agriculture students in hands-on agricultural activities, improving their practical skills and preparing them for careers in agriculture.
- To promote community development by sharing the project's knowledge and best practices with local farmers, fostering an environment of collaboration and knowledge transfer.
- To contribute to the local economy by increasing rice production and providing locally sourced rice to the community.







Methodology:

The project will be carried out through a multi-phase approach that ensures the efficient use of resources and the successful achievement of project objectives.

- Needs Assessment and Planning: A comprehensive needs assessment will be conducted to identify the specific agricultural inputs required for the project. This will include selecting appropriate rice varieties suited to the local climate, determining the fertilizer and pesticide needs, and assessing the tools and equipment necessary for farm operations. Detailed planning will be carried out, including timelines, cost estimates, and resource allocations.
