#### Instructions

1. Supplier shall be responsible for the source(s) of its goods/services/equipment, and which shall be in accordance with the schedule and specifications of the RFQ or contract. Failure of the supplier to comply with this provision shall be ground for cancellation of the award or purchase order issued to the supplier.
2. Supplier that accepted an award, purchase order, or contract but failed to deliver the required goods/services/equipment within the time called for in the award, purchase order, or contract shall be disqualified from participating in MinSU or any of MinSU campuses future procurement activities. 



### Executive Summary

This proposal seeks for the re-establishment of a sustainable poultry production within the Mindoro State University to contribute to food security, academic excellence, and environmental sustainability. The project will be aligned with several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 4 (Quality Education), and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production).

The proposed poultry/broiler production will support the university's mission of fostering practical learning experiences, providing health food alternatives, and promoting sustainability practices. It will serve as a learning/ laboratory center for students and faculty researchers while contributing to local economic development and sustainable food production.

### Rationale

The poultry industry is one fast means of providing the much-needed animal protein to the teeming populace. Today, it is witnessing series of problems such as various disease outbreaks, harsh climatic conditions, and high cost of feeding and day by day decreasing profit margin.

The Department of Agriculture (2020) reported that chicken meat and egg are presently the most progressive animal enterprises in the Philippines. The poultry industry in fact began as a backyard enterprise but has shifted to the formation of very large integrated contract farming operations both for better income and food security.

The growth of the poultry industry in the Philippines has been impressive but the rapid increasing price of commercial feeds, inefficient management and occurrence of several destructive diseases and parasites must be taken into consideration.

In the Philippines, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA, 2016) reported that chicken population will be estimated 174.5 million that is predominantly (47%) accounted for native chicken raised in backyard farms while the remaining. Almost 50% of the total chicken





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population will be accounted for native or village chicken raised in backyard farms while the remaining 34% (broilers) and 19% (layers) will be raised by commercial farms.

## 2. Objectives

The primary objectives of the poultry production facility are:

- To provide a reliable source of poultry products (meat) to the university community and the local population, contributing to better nutrition and food security.
- To offer hands-on training to students, faculty research opportunities, and skills development in sustainable poultry farming, benefiting students in agriculture and environmental studies.
- Implement sustainable farming practices, including efficient waste management, minimal resource consumption, and the use of eco-friendly inputs, ensuring that the production process minimizes environmental impact.

## 3. Justification

- ✓ **Food Security:** With rising global food insecurity, establishing a local poultry production facility can contribute to meeting the university's food demands and reducing dependency on external suppliers.
- ✓ **Educational Value:** Students will gain practical experience in sustainable farming, making the project an integral part of the university's curriculum. This will also open up research opportunities in areas such as animal husbandry and agri-business.
- ✓ **Environmental Sustainability:** By adopting eco-friendly technologies, the facility will minimize its carbon footprint, manage waste efficiently (e.g., using chicken manure as organic fertilizer), and optimize water and energy usage, supporting the university's green initiatives.
- ✓ **Economic Benefits:** The facility will create jobs for students and the surrounding community, promote entrepreneurship through poultry-related businesses, and contribute to the local economy.

## 4. Scope of Work

The proposed facility will focus on;

- **Broiler:** Housing both meat-producing (broilers)
- **Sustainable Practices:** Including free-range poultry farming, efficient feeding systems, water recycling.
- **Education and Training:** Serving as a center for student internships, research projects, and community workshops in poultry farming.
- **Collaboration with Local Farmers:** Providing knowledge exchange and resources to enhance local poultry farming practices.

## 5. Alignment with SDGs

- **SDG 2: Zero Hunger:** By producing high-quality poultry products, the facility will support the fight against hunger and malnutrition.





- **SDG 4: Quality Education:** The facility will serve as a learning and research hub for students in agricultural and environmental disciplines, promoting knowledge in sustainable agriculture.
- **SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production:** By utilizing sustainable farming techniques, the facility will minimize resource use and waste production, encouraging responsible consumption and production.

## 6. Project Implementation Plan

- **Facility Rehabilitation:**
  - Existing poultry houses and related infrastructure, such as feed storage and water management systems will be rehabilitated.
- **Production**
  - Procurement of necessary inputs (stocks, feeds and biologics)
  - Conduct of training sessions for students and staff on poultry management, sustainability practices, and data collection.
- **Full Operation and Research Integration**
  - Expansion on production capacity to meet university needs and local demand.
  - Integrate the project into the university's academic programs and research programs.

## 7. Sustainability Plan

- **Waste Management:** Chicken manure will be composted and used as organic fertilizer in the university's agricultural fields.
- **Water Efficiency:** Rainwater harvesting and recycling systems will be used to minimize water waste.
- **Monitoring and Evaluation:** Regular assessments will be conducted to ensure that the project adheres to sustainable farming practices and achieves its educational and economic goals.


