Bangus fry distribution supports local fisherfolk in Bongabong



Ten (10) local fisherfolk from selected barangays in Bongabong received a significant boost to their livelihoods as the MinSU's Institute of Fisheries Student Organization (IFSO), in partnership with BFAR-MIMAROPA, successfully facilitated the distribution of bangus fry on September 17, 2025, at MinSU-Bongabong Campus.

The fry, sourced through a collaborative agreement between MinSU and BFAR MIMAROPA, were distributed to beneficiaries identified by the Local Government Unit of Bongabong. Each recipient, already operating small-scale fishponds, received the fry as part of an initiative aimed at supporting their aquaculture activities despite limited resources.

Ms. Mary Ann Royo, Officer-in-Charge of the Institute of Fisheries, emphasized the program's broader objectives. "This activity affirms MinSU's commitment to community empowerment by providing initial support to small-scale farmers."

"Through capacity-building, resource linkage, and practical interventions, we aim to strengthen local agribusinesses, improve food security, and promote inclusive growth," she said.

After this, the Institute plans to conduct follow-up visits as well as extension activities based on the needs of the beneficiaries in the succeeding years.

The bangus fry distribution not only provides immediate assistance to local fisherfolk but also highlights the potential of academic institutions to contribute to sustainable rural development, poverty alleviation, and resilient food production in the region. (jdtdc)

The RITE (Research, Innovation, Technology and Extension)
Department led the said initiative, with the support of employees, students, stakeholders, and private donors.

Typhoon Emong struck the province on July 24, 2025, causing severe flooding and heavy silt deposits in various communities. Bound by a generous heart, the University raised a total of ₱160,767 in donations - with Calapan City Campus contributing ₱73,501, Main Campus ₱37,462, and Bongabong Campus ₱49,804.

On August 1, 2025, MinSU Bongabong Campus distributed 105 relief packs to residents of Sitio Gumayos and Sitio Panluan in Brgy. Hagan in Bongabong along with a feeding program for typhoon-hit families.

At the Calapan City Campus, 150 families from Sitio Caguisikan, Brgy. Gutad, Calapan City received relief goods, while 106 pupils from Caguisikan Elementary School were also provided with school supplies on August 4, 2025. On the same day, MinSU Main Campus extended assistance to 112 affected families in Brgy. Bagong Buhay II, Victoria.



MinSU welcomes over 10,000 students for AY 2025-2026

"You are the heart of MinSU," Dr. Enya Marie D. Apostol, University President said as she officially addressed students at the start of the First Semester of Academic Year 2025–2026 on August 4, 2025.

More than 10,000 MinSUans across the University's campuses in Main (Victoria), Calapan City, and Bongabong began their academic journey this semester, including over 2,600 incoming freshmen, eager to embark on their college life at MinSU.

The opening of classes was highlighted by a university-wide welcome program led by President Apostol, joined by key officials and the University Student Government to set the tone for another year of learning, service, and transformation.

MinSU fosters Free Higher Education through UAQTEA Orientations



Mindoro State University (MinSU) continues to strengthen its commitment to free and quality education as it conducted a series of campus-based orientations on the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act (UAQTEA). The sessions were held at MinSU Bongabong and Main Campus, on September 17, 2025, with the final leg completed at MinSU Calapan Campus (MCC) on September 18, 2025.

Facilitated by the Commission on Higher Education Unified Student Financial Assistance System for Tertiary Education (CHED UniFAST) in collaboration with MinSU, the activity aimed to raise awareness among Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) and Tulong Dunong Program (TDP) grantees about their program benefits and responsibilities. The orientations also sought to ensure compliance, provide clarity on financial assistance coverage, and reinforce the university's ties with CHED and UniFAST.

At the Calapan City Campus, the session was led by UniFAST MIMAROPA Lead Regional Coordinator Raniel C. Bacolor, who discussed the benefits under UAQTEA, duration of availment, and other key provisions often unfamiliar to many students.

"This orientation is a step in empowering our students and aligning our institution with national education goals," said Jonbert M. Caoli, Director of OSAS.

Through these orientations, MinSU reaffirms its role in fostering accessible higher education and ensuring that every student maximizes the opportunities provided by UAQTEA. (kpic)

MinSU-Calapan achieves 100% passing rate in CHRA™ Exam



All nine AB Psychology examinees from Mindoro State University – Calapan City Campus (MinSU-Calapan) passed the June 2025 Certified Human Resource Associate (CHRA)™ Exam (Batch 60), earning the campus a 100% passing rate and recognition as one of the topperforming schools nationwide.

The CHRA™ certification serves as a national benchmark for entry-level Human Resource Management, covering areas such as recruitment, labor laws, compensation, ethics, and employee relations.

This milestone highlights MinSU-Calapan's strong academic training and commitment to professional readiness.

Faculty, officials, and students celebrated the achievement, praising the dedication of the passers and the support of the AB Psychology program. *(kpic)*

Añonuevo, Romasanta tops 2024 NAPOLCOM Exam

A graduate of Mindoro State University (MinSU) secured the top rank in the November 2024 National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) PNP Entrance Examination, according to official results released on January 17, 2025.

Keane Justine R. Añonuevo, an alumnus of MinSU's College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE), ranked Top 1 nationwide with a rating of 90.39%, outperforming over 37,000 examinees across the country.

Joining the roster of topnotchers is another MinSU CCJE graduate, Kristine B. Romasanta, who placed Top 18 with a rating of 88.51%.

The November 2024 PNP Entrance Exam was administered on November 24, 2024, in at least 37 testing centers nationwide. Out of 37,705 examinees, only 10,426 passed, translating to a 27.65% passing rate, based on data from NAPOLCOM.

The PNP Entrance Examination is a mandatory requirement for individuals aspiring to join the Philippine National Police (PNP) as Patrolmen and Patrolwomen.

The performance of Añonuevo and Romasanta highlights the academic quality and training provided by MinSU's CCJE, which continues to produce graduates who excel in national licensure and qualifying examinations. (jdtdc)



Towards a Safer Community: MinSU launches H.E.A.L. Program as Sucide Prevention Campaign



"If you are going through a mental health crisis, do not be afraid to speak, share and report, if necessary."

To strengthen awareness on suicide prevention, Mindoro State University's Guidance Office launched the H.E.A.L. (Helping Educator Act for Life) Suicide Prevention Program on August 29, 2025 at the AVR, MinSU Main Campus, Alcate, Victoria.

The seminar, attended by faculty members, security, medical and guidance personnel from the three campuses, aimed to create a taskforce in each campus that will oversee the security, protection and promotion of mental health and suicide prevention in the community.

The first session, entitled "Suicide Prevention Awareness: Identifying Risk Factors & Warning Signs" was facilitated by Ms. Heidelita G. Bumohya, Guidance Counselor III at MinSU Main Campus. In her lecture, she discussed about the early warning signs of potential suicidal attempts in a person and how to notice the signs.

During the second session, Ms. Aleth Attila D. Abarquez, Guidance Counsellor III, Bongabong Campus' Guidance Counselor tackled about ways to respond on the signs and attempts. She led the informative discussion on "How to Race Against Suicide". A series of collaborative activities were done which gave the participants a look on the potential scenarios they might face as a taskforce battling suicidal attempts in the University.

According to them, mental health is a crucial part of a student's and even an employee's life. Thus, proper and adequate attention must be given to address any emerging signs of mental health crisis and suicidal attempts in the community. (kpic)

Mindoro State University (MinSU) strengthened its strategic direction through a three-day seminar titled "MinSU Beyond Today: Capacity Building on Framing the Futures and Value Creation" held on July 21 - 23, 2025, at the Marco Vincent Dive Resort and Hotel, Puerto Galera, Oriental Mindoro.

The capacity-building activity aimed to equip university leaders, faculty and staff with foresight tools and innovative perspectives to position MinSU as the leading university in the MIMAROPA region and beyond. Discussions centered on envisioning future scenarios, anticipating challenges, and aligning institutional strategies with the University's long-term goals.

The seminar featured distinguished resource experts in futures thinking, including Dr. Ramces M. Dili, Assistant Professor II; Ms. Jalaine Joyce V. Malabanan, Fellow of the Philippine Futures Thinking Society and Associate Professor II at the Polytechnic University of the Philippines; Mr. Emmanuel De Guia, Director for Strategic Network and Partnerships of the Philippine Futures Thinking Society; and Dr. Ruperto S. Sangalang, Senior Fellow of the Philippine Futures Thinking Society and former CHED Commissioner.

In her message, Dr. Enya Marie D. Apostol, University President introduced the acronym FUTURE - Foresight, Understand, Transform, Unite, Reframe, and Evaluate - as a guiding framework for MinSU's pursuit of leadership in higher education and innovation.

"This training may not be enough, but it is a big leap to lift MinSU. Malayo na tayo, pero mas malayo pa ang maaabot sa future basta sama-sama," Dr. Apostol expressed.

Through the lens of futures thinking, MinSU continues to strengthen its commitment to quality education, innovation, and leadership with a lasting global impact. (kpic)



Mindoro State University (MinSU) continues to gain international recognition as it joins the 2025 World University Rankings for Innovation (WURI) - for the very first time!

On July 10, 2025, WURI announced that MinSU secured the 328th spot in the WURI Global Top 400 Innovative Universities, a proud milestone for the university and a sign of its growing influence in global higher education.

The World University Rankings for Innovation or WURI, measures universities based on real-world contributions, creative approaches, and entrepreneurial drive, moving beyond the usual academic metrics. This aligns with MinSU's ongoing efforts to develop programs that make a difference not only inside the classroom but in the broader community.

Among many universities worldwide, MinSU stood out in several areas of

innovation. It ranked 10th in University Brand and Reputation (B8) for its strong and trusted image, showing the impact of its effective branding and communication. In Industrial Application (A3), MinSU placed 12th globally, reflecting its success in linking education and research with industry to address real-world challenges.

The university also ranked 22nd in Student Support and Engagement (A1), recognizing its programs that promote student welfare, inclusivity, scholarships, and career development opportunities.

MinSU's inclusion in the WURI rankings follows its earlier debut in the 2025 Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings underscoring the university's

rising international presence.

"This recognition proves that innovation is alive and thriving in MinSU," said Dr. Enya Marie D. Apostol, University President, during her Unang Ulat sa Universidad on July 11, 2025. "MinSU is not just rising - we are ascending," she added.

USBONG Workshop: MIMAROPA HEIs Unite for Growth and Internationalization



CHED MIMAROPA, in partnership with MinSU, Marinduque State University, Romblon State University (RSU) and One Mindoro Association of Higher Education Institution (OMAHEI), successfully hosted the three-day USBONG (Uplifting Service through Borderless Opportunities and Network Growth) Orientation Workshop on September 16-18, 2025 at the University Auditorium, MinSU Main

The event gathered delegates from State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), local Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), and CHED representatives to strengthen collaboration and explore opportunities for academic growth and expansion.

Throughout the sessions, participating HEIs tackled internationalization, quality assurance, sustainability, and SDG-aligned policies. The following day, representatives from RSU led by their University President Dr. Merian P. Catajay-Mani, facilitated the optics about sustainability and aligning University programs with Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).

The final day focused on enhancing research, developing international partnerships, and creating strategic internationalization plans. The workshop also highlighted the power of collaboration in transforming education.

By working together, MIMAROPA HEIs move closer to building a more innovative, sustainable, and globally competitive higher education system.



Passing the Torch:

Bangon Elders teach the art of *Kwako* making



The age-old tradition of crafting *kwako*, the traditional cigar pipe of the Mangyan Bangon Tribe found new life as Bangon elders passed on their skills to the younger generation in a two-day hands-on training on August 14–15, 2025 at Sitio Bayang, Lisap, Bongabong, Oriental Mindoro.

The activity, led by MinSU through its DOST-PCAARRD-funded STC4iD Project, was part of the Handicraft Making component, along with agriculture and literacy programs. Supported by various partners, the training sought to preserve an indigenous art while creating opportunities for livelihood and cultural branding for the Bangon community.

Elders as Mentors, Clay as Heritage

Two respected elders volunteered to guide the process, even helping to gather clay from Barangay Batangan, an authentic and sacred source of kwako materials.

Though one trainer, Tatay Balunan, was unable to attend, fellow craftsman Kondeman Mawwinan recruited Nagi-oy Inyaay, another skilled artisan, ensuring that tradition would still be passed on. Together, they supervised the 14 participants - youth, women, and fellow elders, teaching them step by step the delicate and patient art of shaping a *kwako*. For many, it was their first time shaping clay into a pipe, long associated with the Bangon tribe's traditions.

Crafting with Patience and Skill

The crafting of *kwako* unfolded slowly, guided by the steady hands of the Bangon elders. With clay gathered from Barangay Batangan, participants began by kneading and wedging it, pressing out air pockets and impurities while adding just enough water to achieve the right texture and consistency.

"Ang pagmamasa ng luwad ang pinakapuso ng paggawa ng kwako" (The wedging of clay is the heart of making a kwako), explained Kondeman Mawwinan. "Kapag hindi maayos ang pagkakahanda ng luwad, mabibitak ang kwako bago pa man ito maapuyan" (If the clay is not well-prepared, the kwako will crack before it ever holds fire), he said

Armed with simple tools - two handmade rattans shaped like knives and bent sticks; the participants took their first lumps of clay and began shaping. Gentle taps of bolo blades compacted the clay, which was then scraped and refined little by little with the rattan sticks.





For many, this was the most challenging part. On average, it took about three hours to form just one small pipe. Initially, most of the first molds came out larger than usual, but the elders patiently reminded the group that only two sizes of *kwako* are traditionally

made: small for women and medium for men. The elders also explained that larger molds are impractical for smoking, as they become too heavy for regular use.

By the end of the first day, each participant was able shape at least one mold, since the process demanded hours of patience and precision.

On the second day, the air-dried molds were placed directly into the fire or ember for two to three hours hardening them into usable pipes. Finally, a small bamboo pipe is inserted into the hardened mold, completing the *kwako*, a piece ready for use.

When the last pipe was lifted from the fire, the participants gathered proudly, holding their creations in their hands.



By teaching the youth, the elders made sure this tradition will not be forgotten.

Beyond Craft: Toward Identity and Livelihood

According to Dr. Mary Jeane S. Lubos, Project Team Leader, the activity was not just merely about pipemaking. It was also about keeping the Bangon culture alive.

In the closing program, the facilitators shared plans to improve and innovate the craft so it can be registered as a trademark product of the Bangon Tribe. This will not only serve as a cultural identity but also as a source of income for the community.

Through this training, the torch has been passed. As the Bangon youth learn to shape clay into *kwako*, they are also shaping the future of their heritage ensuring that every puff of smoke carries with it the breath of their ancestors. (*jdtdc*)



PROJECT MOSES showcased in **National S&T events**



Project MOSES (Monitoring and Observation of Site-specific Eweather Stations), Mindoro State University's (MinSU) flagship research initiative, continues to earn national and international recognition after being showcased at two prestigious science and technology gatherings this year.

On July 9-10, 2025, Project MOSES was featured at the 47th Annual Scientific Meeting of the National Academy of Science and Technology (NAST) held at The Manila Hotel. Among nearly 300 research entries nationwide, MinSU's study on the design and development of localized synoptic weather stations in Naujan, Oriental Mindoro, was highlighted during the Scientific Poster Session. Led by Engr. Christian B. Hernandez, Project Team Leader, with a dedicated team of MinSU researchers, the project uses Internet of Things (IoT) technology for localized weather monitoring and disaster resilience.

A month later, from August 7-9, 2025, the innovation was again showcased at the 2025 Handa Pilipinas para sa Bagong Pilipinas -Luzon Leg, organized by the Department of Science and Technology - Cordillera Administrative Region (DOST-CAR) in Baguio City. The exposition, themed "Handa Pilipinas sa Bagong Pilipinas: Innovations in Climate and Disaster Resilience Nationwide Exposition 2025," drew strong interest from local government units and private organizations seeking reliable, site-specific weather monitoring tools.

Developed in partnership with DOST-MIMAROPA, Project MOSES addresses long-standing challenges of high costs, sustainability issues, and reliance on imported systems. Currently, two MOSES stations are fully operational in Oriental Mindoro, (in MinSU Main Campus and San Andres, Naujan) with another under construction in Calapan City. Its expansion, dubbed Project GENESIS (Green Energy Network for Enhanced Synoptic Integrated Station), is now underway with support from the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev).





MinSU i-BIBES Demo Day 2025



Mindoro State University (MinSU) successfully staged the i-BIBES Demo Day 2025 at the MinSU Main Campus Auditorium, Alcate, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro on August 29, 2025.

This brought together students, faculty researchers, entrepreneurs, and industry leaders to present breakthrough solutions addressing key community challenges.

This year's competition focused on four banner programs: Food Innovation, Biowaste Conversion, IoT for Sustainable Communities, and Smart Agriculture and Fisheries. The event also served as a culmination of months of mentorship under MinSU's i-BIBES program, providing participants with the opportunity to pitch their ventures before potential investors, partners, and evaluators.

Distinguished panel members included Jesse M. Pine, DOST-Oriental Mindoro Provincial Director; Mr. Nelson B. Gabutero Sr., owner of Gabutero Organic Farm and member of the MinSU Board of Regents, Engr. Rogelio D. Madarcos, PARPO II of DAR MIMAROPA; Mr. Keenan Comia, Managing Director of plip.ph; Engr. Delfin Cuevas, CEO of Palatak Seeder; and Engr. Joseph Amiel Camingal, President of Hive Energy PH. Ms. Rachel B. Montero of DOST-PSTO Oriental Mindoro also shared insights on the DOST iHUBS initiative.

Dr. Enya Marie D. Apostol, University President underscored the event's importance, noting that i-BIBES Demo Day is more than a competition — it is a platform to catalyze innovation, connect communities, and drive regional progress.



Mindoro State University (MinSU), in partnership with the Department of Agriculture–MIMAROPA (DA-MIMAROPA), has initiated the Modern Agricultural Urban and Peri-Urban Yield Advancement (Project MAUYA), a pioneering initiative aimed at promoting sustainable and smart farming practices in urban and peri-urban communities. The project is currently in its initial phase, with benchmarking activities and design discussions already conducted to finalize the layout and systems of the demonstration site.

Deriving its name from the Hanunuo Mangyan word "mauya" meaning "bountiful harvest," the project seeks to address the challenges of rapid urbanization, shrinking farmlands, and increasing food demand by introducing cutting-edge agricultural technologies such as automated vertical gardens, aquaponics, hydroponics, and drip fertigation systems.

With a combined funding support amounting to ₱5.6 million, consisting of ₱4 million from the Department of Agriculture MIMAROPA and ₱1.62 million from MinSU, the project will establish a demonstration farm and training facility at MinSU Main Campus at Alcate, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro. The site will not only showcase advanced farming systems but also serve as a hub for hands-on training, research, and technology transfer for farmers, students, agricultural practitioners, and local government units.

Among the project's components include the development of smart vertical farming systems for high-value crops such as lettuce, strawberries, bell peppers, and cherry tomatoes; IoT-based aquaponics systems that integrate fish and vegetable production; crop health and biosecurity programs to ensure safe and sustainable farming in controlled environments; agri-enterprise development and value chain integration to strengthen local agribusiness opportunities; and an agri-ecotourism and experiential learning hub that will foster community engagement and knowledge-sharing.

"As our communities continue to urbanize, embracing smart and sustainable farming systems like Project MAUYA becomes essential. This initiative is not only about showcasing modern agricultural technologies, it's about empowering our farmers, researchers, and aspiring agri-entrepreneurs to innovate, adapt, and thrive in a rapidly changing food production landscape," said Engr. Randy A. Joco, Project Leader.

Once fully operational, Project MAUYA is expected to train at least 150 farmers, students, and practitioners, capacitate 50 agricultural extension workers, and generate significant research outputs that will shape the future of smart urban farming in the region.

The initiative is in line with the National Urban and Peri-Urban Agriculture Program (NUPAP) of the Department of Agriculture, which promotes food security, reduced logistics costs, and healthier lifestyles in highly urbanized areas.



MinSU Launches Daluyang Dunong: A Hub for Research and Innovation



Mindoro State University (MinSU) has launched the Daluyang Dunong: Multidisciplinary Research Journal (DDMRJ) - an open-access,

peer-reviewed online platform that promotes the publication and dissemination of scholarly works across various disciplines.

Rebranded from the former MinSCAT Research Journal, Daluyang Dunong aligns with MinSU's identity and commitment to advancing locally-grounded research. The journal highlights studies on biodiversity, indigenous knowledge, technology, and community development, anchored on the University's MAHALTANA Research Agenda.

According to Ms. Charmaine Samala-Guno, Managing Editor, Daluyang Dunong offers a cost-free and credible venue for researchers. "All manuscripts undergo doubleblind peer review, and publication expenses are fully supported by the University," she said.

The journal welcomes submissions from MinSU faculty and external contributors, with interest already received from partner institutions. MinSU is also set to launch college-based journals for students to encourage early research publication.

Mr. Leonel C. Mendoza, OIC-Vice President for Research, Innovation, Technology, and Extension, described the initiative as "a bridge that allows academic knowledge to flow freely and purposefully toward the community and the world."

Mindoro State University (MinSU) has earned a "Very Satisfactory" rating in the 2024 Agency Performance Review conducted by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), also known as the Budget ng Bayan Monitor.

In the assessment, MinSU received a rating of 4.09 percent, marking one of the commendable results among 308 national government agencies and state universities and colleges (SUCs) evaluated for Fiscal Year 2024.

The series of mobile clinic check-ups kicked off at MinSU Calapan Campus on September 2, with 74 beneficiaries, followed by MinSU Bongabong Campus on September 9, with 114 beneficiaries, and culminated at the Main Campus in Victoria on September 16, with 138 beneficiaries.

Employees received consultations, diagnostic tests, and preventive healthcare services under the PhilHealth Konsulta Program, which aims to promote wellness, detect potential health concerns early, and encourage regular medical check-ups.

The program forms part of the government's initiative to make primary healthcare services more accessible nationwide, particularly to government workers and PhilHealth members.

According to DBM's official report, only 4.6 percent of agencies achieved an Outstanding rating. The largest share, 59.3 percent or 181 offices, obtained a Very Satisfactory ratingincluding MinSU, while 94 agencies (30.8 percent) were rated Satisfactory. About five percent of the total received lower ratings, with 15 agencies categorized as Unsatisfactory and one agency rated Poor Performance.

The evaluation criteria included efficient fund utilization, target accomplishment, quality and timeliness of report submission, and other key performance indicators reflecting sound fiscal management and institutional accountability.

The House Committee on Appropriations held its pre-plenary and plenary sessions on September 25-26, 2025 where CHED, PASUC, and SUC leaders, including MinSU, worked together to secure additional funding for higher education.

In a Facebook statement, CHED Chair Dr. Shirley C. Agrupis confirmed that the House committed an extra ₱9.97 billion for the Tertiary Education Subsidy, ICT, and

infrastructure, alongside ₱7.8 billion from the Higher Education Development Fund and ₱4.49 billion to address Free Higher Education gaps.

Ahead of the Senate Budget Briefing for SUCs, Senator Loren Legarda, Senate Committee Chair on Higher, Technical and Vocational Education also convened a meeting with SUC leaders at the Manila Polo Club on September 26, joined by Senators, CHED officials, and PASUC. MinSU reaffirmed its commitment to advocate for greater opportunities and resources for its community, ensuring that quality higher education remains accessible and sustainable.

MinSU forges partnerships for gender empowerment and environmental sustainability



In a continued pursuit of sustainable and inclusive development, new partnerships were forged on August 8, 2025, at the Mindoro State University (MinSU) Calapan City Campus, reinforcing the institution's commitment to research, empowerment, and environmental stewardship.

MinSU and Laguna State Polytechnic University (LSPU) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to advance Gender and Development (GAD) initiatives over a three-year collaboration.

The agreement focused on capacitybuilding programs, research-based projects, and extension services designed to empower women farmers and promote inclusive rural livelihoods.

On the same day, MinSU formalized a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Center for Conservation Innovations PH, Inc. (CCIPH), a non-profit organization devoted to biodiversity conservation. The partnership aims to strengthen research and community-driven initiatives that protect natural resources while fostering sustainable local development.

The forum was part of the 2025 Regional Development Council (RDC) Week Celebration organized by the Department of Economy, Planning, and Development MIMAROPA.

With the theme "9th RDC MIMAROPA: Championing Inclusive and Sustainable Growth through Stakeholder Engagement," the event served as an open platform to discuss how stakeholder participation shapes government policies, project design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation.

During the discussion, Pres. Apostol underscored how MinSU ensures that stakeholders are actively consulted and engaged across its four core mandates: instruction, research, extension, and resource generation. She emphasized that collaboration and consultation are embedded in every stage of the University's initiatives - from planning to execution and monitoring.

Pres. Apostol shared several flagship projects as concrete examples of MinSU's commitment to innovation and partnership. Among these is Project MOSES, funded by DOST-MIMAROPA, which deploys IoT-based weather and soil monitoring systems in the Mag-asawang Tubig Watershed to strengthen disaster preparedness and environmental management.

She also highlighted Project GENESIS, supported by NEDA's (now DEPDev) Innovation Grants, which builds upon MOSES by establishing a renewable-energy-powered operations center and a mobile application that delivers real-time weather and water-level updates to local government units and communities.

Completing the lineup is Project MAUYA, implemented in partnership with DA-MIMAROPA, a modern agriculture hub featuring greenhouses, hydroponics, aquaponics, and aeroponics that functions as a demonstration farm, research hub, and training ground for farmers, extension workers, and students.

She stressed that these projects were made possible through the collective efforts of partner agencies such as DOST, DA, DEPDev, and DENR, alongside LGUs, people's organizations, farmers and fisherfolk groups, extension workers, technologists, students, and community stakeholders.

"Their insights and collaboration ensure that MinSU's programs are responsive, sustainable, and impactful," Pres. Apostol said.

The Kapihan at Kamustahan was among the highlights of RDC MIMAROPA's annual week-long celebration, which brings together regional leaders and stakeholders to discuss inclusive and participatory approaches to socioeconomic development.
